The Association is a non-profit organisation, and it pursues civic aims, for the purposes of solidarity and social utility. The primary purposes of the Association are the following:

- To promote the education and training of children and women in Pakistan, with particular attention to the most disadvantaged persons;
- To support projects aimed at promoting gender equality in the most disadvantaged communities in Pakistan;
- To raise awareness among the Pakistani diaspora community in Europe about the issue of illiteracy in Pakistan, and the importance of education as a tool for promoting tolerance and community advancement;
- To promote cross cultural exchanges between diaspora community in Europe and Pakistan through cultural activities.

IFTCF ANBI, in pursuit of the above aims, carries out exclusively or principally the following activities

- Organize and manage cultural activities for information and dissemination purposes, on subjects such as educational disadvantage and gender equality in Pakistan, and with the aim of promoting The Citizens Foundation Pakistan organization, through events, talks, collaborations with other local and international entities;
- Financially support the building and management of schools and the training of teaching staff, through the NGO The Citizens Foundation in Pakistan;
- Involve the Pakistani community through events, with the aim of promoting Pakistani culture and the role of TCF Pakistan. IFTCF may carry out fund raising activities, also in an organised and continuous manner, to finance its activities of general interest, in compliance with the principles of truth, transparency and fairness in its relations with supporters and the public.

How does the organisation generate income or revenue?

As an ANBI in the Netherlands, IFTCF raises the needed funds through a range of channels, including but not limited to corporate partners, private and public foundations, and individual philanthropy. The fundraising may also be done occasionally through small scale and arge events.

- public contributions
- private contributions
- donations and bequests not destined to increase the assets of the Association;
- revenues from the assets of the Association
- reimbursements under conventions
- funds received from public collections carried out occasionally, including offers of goods of moderate value and services

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### Remuneration policy

The members of the Executive Board shall also perform their activity free of charge. However, they can claim reasonable out-of-pocket expenses incurred on behalf of IFTCF to achieve the organization's objectives, such as fundraising efforts. Expenditure must be based on concrete operational needs and be adopted in compliance with the fundamental principle of economy (and in general of maximum cost containment).

Staff are employed using the Italian National Collective Bargaining Agreements (CCNL) UNEBA, which establish terms and conditions of employment for specific industries or sectors, including provisions for reimbursement and expenses.


In 2024, Italian Friends of The Citizens Foundation - TCF OdV ANBI carried out a series of initiatives in line with its statutory objectives. These focused on promoting quality education, advancing women 's empowerment, and strengthening the Pakistani community in Italy and Europe. Key activities included:

- a) Expanding Access to Education in Remote Areas of Sindh, Pakistan
- b) Promoting Female Literacy and Social Inclusion
- c) Ongoing Support to TCF Schools in Pakistan
- d) Community Engagement and Volunteer Development in the Netherlands and Europe
- e) Awareness-Raising and Fundraising Events in Italy and the Netherlands

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### Explanation

The 2024 balance sheet presents a stable financial position with total assets and liabilities amounting to €126,637. Intangible fixed assets stand at €955, with no tangible or financial fixed assets. The majority of assets are held in liquid funds (€117,168), indicating strong liquidity driven by effective fundraising and prudent cost management. Accounts receivable decreased to €8,514, primarily due to the fact that, unlike in 2023, there were no outstanding grant tranches at year-end. As of December 31, 2023, the foundation was still awaiting a disbursement from a funder (Competence) related to that fiscal year. On the liabilities side, the continuity reserve stands at €36,325, while the initial endowment remains unchanged at €15,000. The year closed with a net positive result of €8,479, reversing the previous year's deficit. Current liabilities include regular operating debts and a €40,000 project-related payable to TCF Pakistan. Overall, the organization remains in solid financial health, with improved liquidity, no long-term debt, and an adequate reserve position.

In 2024, Italian Friends of TCF OdV entered a critical phase of growth and consolidation, recognised as an ANBI in the Netherlands and expanding across Europe. Total income rose by over 50%, driven by institutional grants, individual giving, and two non-commercial fundraising events. The donor base matured, with a 60% increase in contributors and growing diaspora engagement. Expenditures remained stable and focused on grants to TCF Pakistan, with a year-end surplus of €8,479 allocated to reserves. The organisation enters 2025 with strong partnerships, enhanced financial oversight, and positive early indicators of further growth, underscoring its deepening role in TCF's global mission.
